

In Maths this term, we will be focusing on number and place value, decimals and geometry. When we look at number and place value, we will closely link it to Anglo-Saxons and learn about their currency. We will also be looking at graphs and time.

This term we will be looking at various types of writing within English.

Our writing cycles will incorporate themes from our chosen books: *The Skies Above My Eyes* and *Cosmic*.

We will be exploring the features of a range of texts within our writing. This includes biographies, newspaper articles, narratives and explanation texts.

In Science, we will be learning all about forces and space. We will explore how forces interact with a variety of objects and what role they have in our solar system. Our space unit will look closely at our solar system and the children will undertake investigations to help advise on how to ensure safe travel to and from space!

What's in the stars?

During Geography we will be looking at the Earth from space. We will be plotting rivers, mountain ranges and countries on a variety of satellite images.

Within Music**, we will be learning about different pieces of music from space series and compare them. We will use inspiration from these to create our own music for a space rover launch.

Through RE, we will be learning about 'Christians and how to live: What would Jesus do?', and answering the question 'Why is the Torah so important to Jewish people?'.

In PE** we will be covering dance and rounders. We will learn about the rules of rounders, as well as how to take part in sports safely.

In Computing we will be learning about handling data and coding and programming.

In Art** this term, we will be developing and applying our digital media and sculpting skills. We will produce an online poster to advertise a new space rover and explore how we can create texture using clay.

During Design and Technology**, we will be learning about mechanics and computing to design and build our own robust space rovers!

In History we will be looking at who the Stuarts are and exploring their role in our understanding of space and forces today. We will look in depth at Sir Isaac Newton and the impact of his work.

In our French lessons this term, we will be learning about numbers up to 50 and asking for different types of food.

In PSHE, we will be exploring our dreams and goals, and how we can achieve them, as well as the topic 'Healthy me'. This topic will cover a variety of factors, which can affect our physical health.
