As part of our safety measures, staff at Cam Woodfield Junior School continue to use lateral flow test (LFT) tests (throat and nasal swabs) to test twice a week. As part of the governments roadmap to lift restrictions, they are now extending the offer that is already in place for primary school staff to offer lateral flow tests for home self-administration to anyone within your household bubble and support bubble. (This excludes primary school aged children). The lateral flow tests are for the identification of asymptomatic cases of covid-19.
