Using page 1 of 'The Creation Story', record as many questions as you can for the author that you have about the story so far, and explain why the answer to the question will help you as a reader to understand the characters, events or story. Choose one colour for your question and a different colour for your explanation.

You might like to group your questions into: characters, setting/ location, events, atmosphere/ themes.

For example:

Characters

Why does the first brother mock the youngest brother?

The answer to this question would help us to understand the relationship between the first brother and the youngest. It might also provide us with information about events that have happened in the past that have caused this mockery. As a reader, it might help us to understand what each brother is like and this will help us to predict how they might behave in future events within the story.

Why did the Toucan tell the youngest brother to ask for a snail shell?

The answer to this question would help a reader to understand if the Toucan knew something that the brothers didn't because the snail shell made the land appear when there wasn't any before. It might also help us know if the Toucan is good and if he did it to help the young brother and not to humiliate him.

Why did the eldest brother become a god of waters?

The answer to this question might help us to understand if anything has happened in the past, that has given him the privilege to be a god of water or if something has happened that made the water take a liking to him. As a reader, it might help us understand what the brother could have in common with water

to make him a god of it, it will also help us predict how they might take this duty in the future.

Why were the brothers not brave and why did they not try to face land?

The answer to this question might help us to understand what they were feeling at the time when the land rose up from the ground. It might also help us realise if there have been any past dreams or encounters that have made them feel this towards the land. As a reader, it might help us understand why they didn't try to go onto the land and why they sent an animal out to test it instead of them, it will also help us predict if they come to like it in the future or not.
