### Whole School Event - CWJS Celebration Surprise! Monday 19th July

The school has arranged a special event for all pupils to take part in on Monday 19th July. Pupils do not need to wear school uniform on this day, but they must wear something comfortable that they can run around in during the event. There is a list below with what not to wear and what would be ideal on the day. Due to the activity, pupils must **NOT** wear the following: heeled shoes or sandals, short dresses or skirts, pointed cat ear headbands or jewellery (stud earrings will be covered with a plaster whilst your child takes part - this is normal school protocol for PE lessons).

If pupils wear any of these items above, they will not be able to take part.

Jogging bottoms, leggings, t-shirt that covers the arms and trainers. If our child has long hair, then this needs to be put up into a ponytail etc.
